



Student Dress Code

Purpose

Dress codes for public schools are determined by school boards in consultation with students, their parents and staff of the school. Our Dress Code outlines the standards expected of students and plays an important role in promoting a positive image of our school. Our Dress Code supports all students to participate fully in school life. It also helps us to create a sense of identity and a school culture in which every student experiences a sense of belonging.

School Uniform

- Black shorts (mid thigh and loose fitting walk short), sports skirt, black pants, skirt or leggings;
- Koorana school dress;
- Koorana tee shirt, polo shirt or faction shirt;
- Koorana jacket or black windcheater;
- Hat or cap;
- Enclosed footwear appropriate and safe for the activity, excursion or incursion;
- Hair is to be worn neat, clean and tied off face (long hair should be tied back).

Acceptable Accessories

- *Small* stud earrings or *small* sleepers, watches (no Smart Watches) and medic-alert bracelets/necklaces;
- Hair accessories – school colours preferred.

Non-appropriate Items

- Singlets tops;
- Board shorts;
- Jeggings;
- Clothing with hoods, brand logos, obscenities or graphics;
- Additional decorative jewellery;
- Additional decorative hair accessories;
- Thongs, shoes with high heels/platforms or slip on shoes without a back;
- Cosmetics, make up or nail polish;
- Tattoos or body paint;
- Coloured hairspray unless for a special occasion;
- Additional, obvious piercing and ear expanders.

Excluded

- Denim items are totally excluded from all dress codes in ALL WA PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Guidelines for Staff

- Staff will pursue a positive approach to the Dress Code, encouraging students to follow acceptable school directions.
- In the event that a student's dress does not comply with the Dress Code, staff will discuss the matter with the parents/carers (and/or student, if appropriate), requesting that the Dress Code be followed.
- Repeated non-compliance will lead to a letter from the Principal and/or a meeting to discuss the non-compliance.
- Students attending out-of-school activities are expected to follow with the Dress Code unless parents/carers are otherwise notified.
